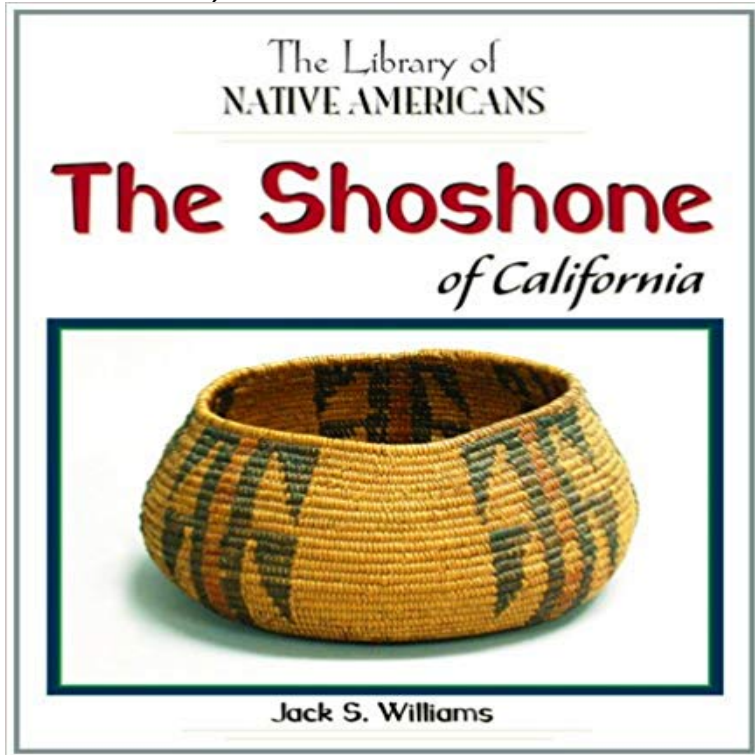


The Shoshone of California (The Library of Native Americans of California)
