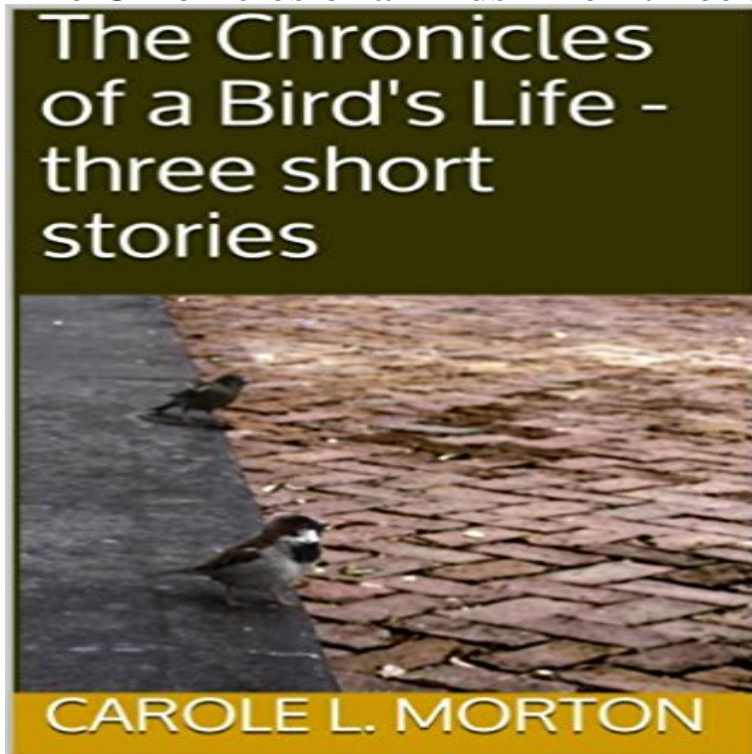


## The Chronicles of a Birds Life - three short stories for children



The Chronicles of a Birds Life is a childrens book containing three stories ~ the first is about a little Robin that gets into one mishap after another that could end in disaster; the second story is about a pair of Cardinals and their confrontation with a predator, a Red-tailed hawk, that raids the feeding station; and the third story is about a family of Black-capped Chickadees and the young fledglings first lessons at leaving their nest and learning to fly. Even the animal kingdom has a classroom for their young, and they seem to have a sense of love for their mates and family members. See what happens as each story unfolds. These stories are written to introduce young children (ages 7 thru 10) to bird-watching, and learning about the lives of birds. The individual short stories would be great for night-time story telling before bed.
